Term of the day: anthropomorphism

- attribution of human characteristics (traits, emotions, intentions) to a deity or other non-human entity.
 - Unlike personification because the deity is actually displaying these human characteristics.
- Greek gods were **anthropomorphic**—they displayed human traits and emotions and generally acted like humans.
