- Why do you think that this moment is the one that gets to Odysseus the most? Support your claim with evidence from the text that you give and analyze.

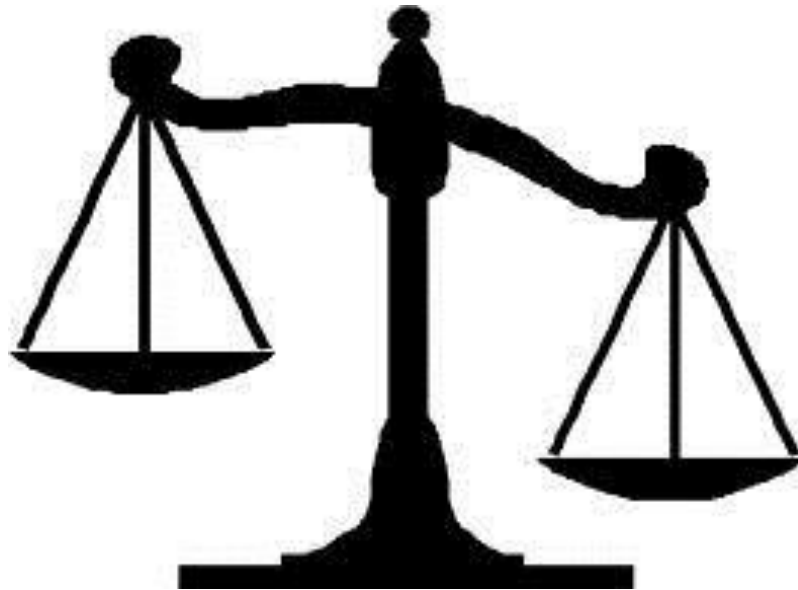


Term of the day: nostos
